Game: Write the letters sh out 10 times on a card/paper. Cut them out and stick them in different places around the house. How many letters can you find in 30 seconds? Reading: Can you read the words in this story Mox's Shop https://www.starfall.com/h/ltr-sv-o/ma-w-ot/?sn=ltr-classic</p>	<p>Phonics: Practice saying the sh Can you draw these words in your copy? Ship, shark, shop Matching Game: Can you match the ot words with the pictures? Write down pot, cot, dot, hot and shot on piece of card and cut the words out. Draw the pictures for each word. Cut them out so that a picture matches a word. Turn them over and mix them up. Take turns to find the matching pair!</p>	<p>Phonics: Can you remember what sound these letters make: g, o ,u ,l, f, b, X, y, z, w, qu? Can you write them when called out? Bingo: play with parent/siblings- write out the letters g, o ,u ,l, f, b, X, y, z, w, qu on card/paper, cut them out On another piece of paper write out any 6 of the letters. Bingo master calls out the sound, whoever has all the letter checked first is the winner and is bingo master next time. Can you read these words? https://youtu.be/8rejIMU6a44</p>
<p>PE: Play outside Can you complete all of these activities? https://youtu.be/x_9L5_A6Ww4</p>	<p>Geography: Can you remember some animals that live on the farm? Can you name some animals and their babies? Sheep-lamb Cow-calf Horse- foal Duck-duckling Hen-chick Goat- kid Draw a picture of your favourite farm animal</p>	<p>Science: Investigate light and shade (shadows) Do you know how shadows are made? If it is sunny, go outside and see if you can find your shadow? If you are inside, turn on a light and see if you can find your shadow! When you stand in front of the light, you make a shadow! What makes colour lighter and darker? If you have some different colour paints you can complete an experiment Pick one colour such as red, What happens if you add white to it? It gets lighter, it turns pink) What happens if you add black to the red? It goes darker, it turns into a dark red. Start at 15, stop at 50 Start at 26, stop at 50 Start at 32, stop at 50.</p> <p>Copy work: Can you write the numbers 1-20? Do you notice a pattern? The teens have a 1 in front of them!</p> <p>Addition within 10 Play this game: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/teddy-numbers</p> <p>Can you write these sums in your copy</p> <p>3+2= 4+4= 5+3= 6+2= 7+2= 8+2= 7+3= Don't forget to use your fingers or blocks to help you add.</p>	<p>Maths: Counting: Play counting Tennis 1-50. You and child say every second number Parent says 1, child 2, parent 3, child 4 and so on...whoever lands on 50 wins. What number comes after 9, 12, 16, 23, 27, 29</p> <p>Write the numbers 10-20 cut them out. Mix them up. Can you order them, starting at the number 10?</p> <p>Mix them up again and pick out 5 different numbers. Can you order them, starting with the smallest number and finish with the largest number example 12, 15, 17, 19, 20</p> <p>Smallest number goes beside your left hand and the largest number should be at your right hand.</p> <p>Listen to the number rhyme Five little Speckled frogs https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Flash.aspx?bbc=fiveLittleSpeckledFrogs</p>	<p>Maths: Counting: Lets count up to 50 while doing jumping jacks! Start at 25 and stop at 50 Start at 30 and stop at 50</p> <p>Capacity Watch this video to explain holds more and holds less https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6lWnl7v9gGY</p> <p>Doubles: Can you remember the doubles using your fingers? (1+1=2, 2+2=4, 3+3=6, 4+4=8,5+5=10) Can you remember what 6+6 and 7+7 make? (12 and 14)</p> <p>Get 7 pairs of socks, separate them so you should have 14 socks. Now pair them, saying 1+1=2...7+7=14</p> <p>Can you write them in your copy</p>	<p>Maths: Counting: backwards from 15-0 Can you count from 20-0? What number comes before: 7, 9, 12, 16 , 19</p> <p>Addition: Get 10 corn flakes/hoops/ sweets/ marshmallows or whatever you can find, the sweeter the better!</p> <p>Get 2 plates and a bowl.</p> <p>Put 4 objects on one plate, and 3 objects in the other plate. Then put the 4 objects into the bowl counting them and adding in the 3 objects. Then you say, 4 and 3 makes 7. Can you make 5 +3 (5 on one plate, 3 o the other, then put them in the bowl counting...5+3 make 8.</p> <p>Can you make these and then write them in your copy? 6+3=, 7+1=, 5+4=</p>	<p>Maths: Counting: Can you count to 50 while stamping your feet, changing your foot with every number!</p> <p>Play this capacity game: https://ie.mathgames.com/skill/1.7-holds-more-or-less</p> <p>Copy work: Roll the dice (if you don't have a dice you can roll a virtual one online or make one!) Roll the dice and double the answer and write the sum in your copy. Example: I rolled the dice and got the number 3. 3+3=6</p>
